Competency Q Preventing, Recognizing, and Reporting Abuse

Of the following scenarios, please indicate to the left if the situation warrants the Direct Support Professional to Report (R) or Not Report (NR).

Please note that every situation is situational-specific. Decisions made regarding formal reporting and filing are a case-by-case scenario. In addition, this guidance is in no way instructing anyone not to call and report situations that they feel necessary.

1

_____ A minimal breach in someone's supervision within the site in which it was an isolated incident and the person was not negatively impacted as a result, nor at risk for harm.

2

_____ A vehicle accident in which a staff member was speeding. Injuries were sustained to people supported and/or they were emotionally impacted.

3

_____ An interaction between a staff member and person supported in which the staff over prompted a person supported and the person supported became upset by the prompting and said the staff was being mean. The person supported has a diagnosed processing delay and has a staff support for prompting (which was not implemented). The staff member's voice was raised and they appeared to be frustrated.

4

_____ A staff member hid and locked up food to prevent a person supported from over-eating. The person does have a doctor ordered, reduced-calorie diet, but does not have an approved plan for food restriction or for locking up food.

5

_____ Two people supported who are not sexually consenting were observed hugging and kissing. Staff intervened and neither was upset by the situation.

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
